THE CAREER & INDUSTRY ACADEMY

The Career & Industry Academy offers an opportunity for students to gain real work experience, industry certifications, and technical college credit. Students choose one of three programs of study:

- Facilities Engineering Technology
 - HVAC, Plumbing, Electrical, Construction (Level 1 and Level 2 Certifications, Associate's Degree)
- Hotel & Resort Management
- Digital Arts and Multimedia Influencer



COLLEGIATE ACADEMY

CSISD partners with Blinn College to allow CVHS to offer 42 hours of college-credit courses. Through a combination of high school and college dual credit coursework, students have the potential to receive the following:

- Up to 42 hours of college credit, transferable to any Texas public university
- The ability to enter a 4-year university as a second semester sophomore



ACCELERATED ACADEMY

Students in the Accelerated Academy can accelerate their timeline to graduation. Whether they have fallen behind or desire early graduation, students can achieve the following:

- Earn a foundation high school diploma with endorsement (26 credits) through a custom graduation plan
- Participate in Edgenuity computer-based courses, Graduation Alliance blended learning, and in-person courses
- Attend half day learning sessions if eligible for the Optional Flexible School Day Program

Through a combination of high school and college level coursework, student's have the potential to receive the following:

- Up to 42 hours of college credit that is transferable to any Texas public university.
- The ability to enter a 4-year university as a second semester sophomore.

Please note that the sooner a student enrolls at CVHS the better the opportunity to receive all 42 hours. The Collegiate Academy is open to all incoming 9th grade students and all students who are currently in high school but not yet a senior. Students that come to CVHS after their freshman year will take as many dual credit classes for college credit as possible but may not be able to get all 42 hours.

Benefits of dual credit courses at CVHS:

- Students take the courses at no-cost. Save Money!
- Smaller class sizes allow for more interaction with the dual credit instructor.

Requirements to enroll in the Collegiate Academy

- Apply to Blinn College
- Meet college readiness requirements via TSI, PSAT, SAT or ACT
- Maintain at least a 2.0 GPA
- Volunteer hours

ACCELERATED ACADEMY

CVHS strives to serve all students in CSISD especially if they have fallen behind or circumstances require students to graduate early. The Accelerated Academy will allow students, who fall under these two areas, to obtain their diploma. All accelerated academy students will be provided an individualized plan.

Students can achieve the following through the Accelerated Academy:

- Earn a foundation high school diploma with endorsement (26 credits)
- Accelerated pace through a custom graduation plan
- Includes in-person and Edgenuity courses

Students interested in becoming part of the Accelerated Academy can qualify two ways:

Students that are behind in credits -

1. Must have a minimum of 18 credits at the time of the application.
2. Must have at least tested in all 5 End of Course Exams (EOC)
 - Algebra 1
 - English 1
 - English 2
 - Biology
 - U.S. History

Students who wish to graduate early -

1. Be on track or ahead in credits at the time of the application.
2. Be willing to take both face-to-face and Edgenuity courses to accelerate graduation date.

Please note that previous discipline and/or attendance issues will be considered in the application process. Although infractions do not disqualify students from being accepted, a discipline/attendance contract may be issued if the student is accepted that would be signed by both the student and parent/guardian.



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CVHS ACCELERATED ACADEMY

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- Participate in Edgenuity computer-based courses, Graduation Alliance blended learning, and in-person courses



The CVHS Accelerated Academy is a TEA approved Optional Flexible School Day Program (OFSDP).

- Students who meet eligibility for the OFSDP may choose either to attend the full school day or in the morning or afternoon for 4 hours.

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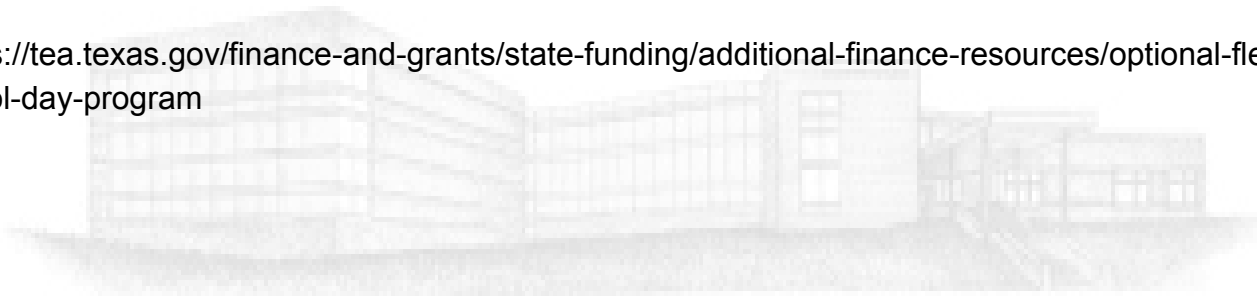
OPTIONAL FLEXIBLE SCHOOL DAY PROGRAM (OFSDP)

OFSDP is a specialized ½ day program that falls under the umbrella of the Accelerated Academy. The Optional Flexible School Day Program (OFSDP) allows districts to provide flexible hours and days of attendance for students. CVHS offers two sessions which include (8:00 - 12:00 pm) or (12:00 - 4:00 pm).

Students that are interested will be provided information and qualifications for being accepted into this program.

CAREER & INDUSTRY ACADEMY

The Career & Industry (C&I) Academy offers an amazing opportunity for all CSISD students with a variety of talents looking at a variety of innovative pathways after high school. The C&I Academy is broken down into 4 parts:

- Facilities Engineering Technology
 - HVAC, Plumbing, Electrical, Construction (Level 1 and Level 2 Certifications, Associate Degree)
- Hotel & Resort Management (Level 1 Certification)
- Digital Arts and Multimedia Influencer (Program of Study)

Facilities Engineering Technology

- Attend school at both CVHS and Texas A&M Rellis campuses.
- Achieve a Level 1 certification (Electrical and Construction) by completing 24 hours of CTE Technical dual credit at the Rellis Campus through hands-on lab work in both areas from professionally licensed instructors.
- Achieve a Level 2 certification (Electrical, Construction, Plumbing, HVAC) by completing 39 hours of CTE technical dual credit at the Rellis Campus through hands-on lab work in all four areas from professionally licensed instructors.
- Achieve an Associates Degree in Facilities Maintenance by completing 60 hours of both Academic and CTE technical dual credit with certified Blinn academic instructors at CVHS and through hands-on lab work in all four areas from professionally licensed instructors at Texas A&M Rellis.

Benefits of FET -

1. Attend a college campus and college classes while in high school.
2. Graduate with a diploma and industry level certifications (1 or 2) qualifying a student to enter the workforce immediately after high school in high demand competitive paying skilled jobs.
3. Potentially receive an Associates Degree (must complete 60 hours) upon graduation from high school leaving only two years of college to achieve a bachelor's degree.
